

LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

Meeting was held 9-12-22.

In the absence of a Missions & Service Team chair, the **Finance & Facility Team** will be taking care of sending out the remaining congregational pledges for 2022. A laptop will soon become available for reproducing worship CD's for shut-ins. This ministry is still needed for those who cannot access YouTube. The church building's fire system will have it's annual testing done soon. Phone lines are going to be transferred from a landline to an internet provider, saving the church approx. \$800 per year. Teams have begun working on their 2023 budget proposals.

The **Worship Team** will continue to provide special music, perhaps monthly. A reminder to the ushers that the pew Friendship pads need to be refilled by the ushers. Terry will advise as to the location of the replacement pads.

The 5th Sunday luncheon will be held on 10-31-22. Dates for our annual fall Older Servant's Dinner are being considered. Worship Nursery coverage will be assessed by the **Hospitality & Communications Team**. Volunteers were listed on the recent Gifts & Talents Survey. Faith & Grace will continue to provide worship coverage through December. Pre-K SS teachers will include any Nursery children for the SS hour.

Rally Day was a successful day with a lot of momentum and enthusiasm. The **Christian Ed Team** is hopeful that the momentum will continue and that the SS program will grow. Children's Church will be offered each Sunday, with the exception of the 2nd Sunday of each month. A new SS class is being offered; it is for post-high & young adults; it is called "Let's Talk". The Team has begun to look at ideas for the Advent & Christmas seasons.

White Gift offering opportunity will again be available. Envelopes will be provided for contributions. This offering is typically used to help us meet our year-end outreach pledges. Valerie Smith will look into the need for mittens, scarves & hats for a giving tree outreach in the absence of a **M&S Team** chair.

Deacons will be making communion bread on 9-27-22.

Pastor Dave will be officiating at a wedding on 9-17-22 and will then attend District Conference. He will give a requested brief oral presentation on our church & "Jesus in the Neighborhood". There is a nice article in the Sept. Messenger regarding his recent career change and ordination.


Paper supplies in the kitchen need to be restocked; looking into who is responsible for this.

Sparring Partners by John Grisham


"Homecoming" takes us back to Ford County, the fictional setting of many of John Grisham's unforgettable stories. Jake Brigance is back, but he's not in the courtroom. He's called upon to help an old friend, Mack Stafford, a former lawyer in Clanton, who three years earlier became a local legend when he stole money from his clients, divorced his wife, filed for bankruptcy, and left his family in the middle of the night, never to be heard from again—until now. Now Mack is back, and he's leaning on his old pals, Jake and Harry Rex, to help him return. His homecoming does not go as planned.

In "Strawberry Moon," we meet Cody Wallace, a young death row inmate only three hours away from execution. His lawyers can't save him, the courts slam the door, and the governor says no to a last-minute request for clemency. As the clock winds down, Cody has one final request.

The "Sparring Partners" are the Malloy brothers, Kirk and Rusty, two successful young lawyers who inherited a once prosperous firm when its founder, their father, was sent to prison. Kirk and Rusty loathe each other, and speak to each other only when necessary. As the firm disintegrates, the resulting fiasco falls into the lap of Diantha Bradshaw, the only person the partners trust. Can she save the Malloys, or does she take a stand for the first time in her career and try to save herself?

A prayer for pumpkin people

After Liz Curtis Higgs wrote the popular children's book The Pumpkin Patch Parable, people began using her analogies to say a prayer while carving their Halloween pumpkins. The pumpkin prayer, a Christian alternative to Halloween traditions, reminds people of all ages what God has done for us. Use it this fall when your family makes jack-o'-lanterns.

- While cutting off the top of the pumpkin, pray, "Lord, open my mind so I can learn new things about you." (See Proverbs 1:7.)
- While removing the seeds and pulp, pray, "Remove the things in my life that don't please you. Forgive the wrong things I do, and help me forgive others." (See Matthew 6:14-15.)
- While making eyes, pray, "Open my eyes to see the beauty you've made in the world around me." (See Psalm 104:24.)
- While making the nose, pray, "I'm sorry for the times I've turned up my nose at your many gifts." (See James 1:17.)
- While making the mouth, pray, "Let everything I say please you." (See Psalm 19:14.)
- While lighting the candle, pray, "Lord, help me show your light to others through the things I do." (See Matthew 5:16.)

Deacons

We will be requesting names of those you would like to see called as Deacons on October 9th, so we ask that you prayerfully consider those in our midst who you feel are called to serve First Church and its ministries. Please read what the Constitution states about Deacons as you make your decisions. Then on October 23rd we will be voting on names submitted.

From our Constitution

SECTION 10 - Deacons

- 1. The Deacon Body shall consist of all duly called and installed Deacons of the church as defined by Annual Conference and the Middle District of Pennsylvania. The duties of this body shall be to assist the Pastor(s) in counseling and ministering to the sick, the unfortunate, and the needy; to assume general oversight of the physical arrangements for observing the ordinances of Baptism and Lovefeast; to cooperate with the Pastor(s) in the visitation of members to maintain the standards for credentials of membership; and to counsel and approve all candidates for the ministry.
- 2. Any member of the congregation in good standing is eligible to be called to the Deacon Ministry. (A member in good standing shall be defined as one who is faithfully fulfilling his/her baptismal vows. These vows are confessions of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and worshipping, serving, and sharing in the programs of the congregation by prayer, regular attendance, loyal service, outreach, and faithful stewardship).
- 3. Deacons shall be called to a term of 5 years of office, with no limit to the number of terms to which they may be called. Any Deacon serving 20 or more years may elect to become Deacon emeritus. The process of calling Deacons shall be detailed in the Deacon minutes. Changes to the process must be approved by the congregation at a Congregational Forum.
- 4. The Deacons shall elect their own chairperson/officers. The Senior Pastor (and Associate Pastor) shall serve as ex-officio members of the Deacon Body.

Be the last to criticize a colleague who fails.


