Many of the long time members and attendees of our church already know this, but as a reminder, and more for those who have recently been welcomed into our family, I wanted to take this opportunity to talk to you about one of the highlights of our ecclesiastical calendar – the upcoming Christmas Eve service

Every Christmas Eve, the members of the Roaring Spring First Church of the Brethren come together with any other so-minded guests to honor the long-held tradition of worshipping and expressing our gratitude and respect for the impending birth of the Baby Jesus.

Beloved Christmas carols are sung, the final candle of the Advent is lit, the Christmas story is retold in stirring words, and a candlelight service representing the coming of the Light of the World all combine to add that final, sacred thread to the meaningful preparation for the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior.

Another tradition that will continue this year during that service is the giving of a White Gift Offering. In keeping with the idea of Christmas being a time to share with those around us, this opportunity is one that has come to fill an important place in our church finances.

Traditionally this Christmas Eve offering has been used to help complete our outreach giving for the year. In those years that unexpected expenditures and lower than anticipated budgeted revenues cut into our intended giving, it has been this offering that has helped fill in the gaps in our support of local, community and denominational opportunities. Items that we support that are included on the Missions and Services Commission budget benefit from the Christmas Eve offering as we continue to try to be "the hands, feet --- and wallet" for those around us who need the help and support.

Our Leadership Team is working hard to make sure that your support continues to be used efficiently to do God's work through our church. We appreciate ALL of your financial and prayer support and wanted to continue our efforts to be transparent about how your support and encouragement is appreciated and used for God's glory.



#### **LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT**

Meeting was held 11-6-22.

A laptop is now available again for reproducing worship CD's for shut ins. This ministry is still needed for those who cannot access YouTube.

Phone service provider switchover has not been completed to date. Please be patient as work continues in this respect.

Facebook, Instagram & the church's website are now being handled through a local company called Impel. It is a 1-year contract & will be re-evaluated at its expiration.

A new church logo is being created & the Leadership Team gave approval on 1 of 6 designs. It will be used on things such as church letterhead & the website.

The current issue with the bank fraud & the church's accounts is being monitored & Bryce Nooyen is working closely with the local M&T Bank where the accounts are held. There will be no funds lost.

A proposal to upgrade the church's elevator was presented. After much discussion, it was agreed that the information should be presented at the upcoming Congregational Forum & take direction from there. The water cooler in the Fellowship Hall has been moved into the Fireplace Room & is to remain there. Any monetary donations for the exterior Blessing Box should be marked as such & placed in the offering plate. Our annual Giving Tree outreach will be going to the RS Library again this year. It will include winter wear for children. Please watch the newsletter & bulletins for updates.

The Worship Team will be working on Advent season worship services along with a Blue Christmas morning service. A discussion was held on purchasing 3 new artificial Christmas trees for the sanctuary. Approval was given.

Hospitality & Communications will be closing out the year with a Fall Bash & a Christmas Party for Jesus.

Mike & Becky Bianconi, Dave & Valerie Smith and Paul & Julie Witkovsky were called & have accepted, to serve as deacons for new 5-year terms beginning 1-1-23.

For the 2nd year, the traditional fruit gift bags will be replaced with useful personal items gifted to those in our congregation over the age of 70, or who are shut-in, or who are widowed.

The children will be presenting a Christmas program in December.

The newly formed Young Adult class has had 1 participant.

Advent activities for adults & children will be available soon.

Nursery, Pre-K & K will now be combined for the SS hour.

Discussion was held on youth activities & the combining of the 2 youth groups. It remains suitable to combine the groups for things such as Sunday School & Bible studies when attendance is down. All other activities need to remain separated, as was discussed & approved by the Leadership Team in February. In addition, NYC should be open to any youth that fits the age criteria as set by our congregation whether they are able to participate in activities or attend church regularly. Guidelines for attending NYC need to be reviewed & perhaps revised. CE chairs will discuss these items with the current Youth advisors.

The 2023 proposed budget, slates, & Forum agenda were all approved.

Next meeting is 12-6-22.

#### THE MANGER

"THE MANGER LAMB. God is in the details - AMAZINGLY so! Mangers are feed troughs. In ancient Israel and still in the middle east, they're made of stone. In a pinch, they can be a protective bassinette. That's why the priests of Bethlehem, would place lambs in them. Not \*all lambs; just those that were without blemish and suitable for the blood sacrifices. Sacrifices to cover sin.

These were lambs Bethlehem was known for. Near the hills, there with a tower named "Migdal Eder" and the flocks nearby produced lambs for sacrifice.

When the time neared, the priests chose the lambs for sacrifice, those without blemishes. To protect them, they'd wrap them snuggly in cloth - they'd swaddle them. Then they'd lay the lambs in stone mangers for until their time came.

"Manger" is only mentioned in one account of Jesus' birth (in Luke). And now all this should make sense to you. However, on that holy night long ago, there was only a small group of people who would understand it's significance. Those who heard the words: "You will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloth, and lying in a manger." ... Shepherds! Bethlehem area shepherds of the sacrificial flock.

The shepherds knew what the swaddling cloth and the manger meant. "This will be a sign unto you," the angel said. And it was. It wouldn't have been a sign to many. But to them? Most definitely. And this detail was staggering. The long expected messiah King wasn't destined for a palace in this world. No, the Lamb of God was going to be sacrificed."






Meetings are the third Monday of each month at 10 am in the Parlor. Join us as we discuss the monthly selection.

December's Selection: Lila by Marilynne Robinson

Lila, homeless and alone after years of roaming the countryside, steps inside a small-town lowa church - the only available shelter from the rain - and ignites a romance and a debate that will reshape her life. She becomes the wife of a minister, John Ames, and begins a new existence while trying to make sense of the life that preceded her newfound security.

Neglected as a toddler, Lila was rescued by Doll, a canny young drifter, and brought up by her in a hardscrabble childhood. Together they crafted a life on the run, living hand to mouth with nothing but their sisterly bond and a ragged blade to protect them. Despite bouts of petty violence and moments of desperation, their shared life was laced with moments of joy and love. When Lila arrives in Gilead, she struggles to reconcile the life of her makeshift family and their days of hardship with the gentle Christian worldview of her husband which paradoxically judges those she loves.

Cost is \$11.00 each.



If you have questions, please feel free to speak with either Pastor Dave or Kaye Russell.




