A few moments of History...

It is with pride I present for you a snip-it of the history of the Church (Brethren/First Church). The Church of the Brethren was founded in 1708 in Schwarzenau, Germany. Individuals who wished to escape from rigid religious customs of this period decided to meet secretly in small groups to study the Bible and pray. They felt that Christianity was to be lived, not merely talked about. This belief led Alexander Mack and seven others to begin what we know as Brethren. The first Brethren to set foot in America was Peter Becker in 1719 in Germantown, Pa, but it was not until after the American Revolution that Brethren settled in the Middle District.

Our local history shows that the Clover Creek Church (est.1790) was considered our "Mother Church". Eventually, the Albright Church right outside of town was established in 1898 and was the initial Brethren Church in Roaring Spring. However, the women, especially the young women who had to walk their young children from downtown Roaring Spring twice a day on Sunday and then again on Wednesday if not more complained of the distance and wished for a Church in town. These women admired the pipe organ and the beautiful music and singing at the Methodist Church in town. So a group of very strong minded women met at the home of Susan Replogle and decided they would raise the necessary funds to purchase a plot of ground in

the borough to establish a Church. Although, the men felt the ground on the Lower Farm was too much, and would still be on a hill they were extremely concerned that the congregation of the Albright Church may be offended.

But the women of the Sisters Sewing Society were very determined and began selling bonnets, aprons, prayer coverings, quilts and vanilla for 2 years until they raised enough money to purchase two plots of land for \$250 each in 1908. The ladies turned around and sold the land to the new Church Board for \$1.00. Our history shows that a group of approximately 60 men and women worked together to raise \$9000 to build the original structure of our church which was 62'X 66' in size and consisted of the Sanctuary, Ladies Aid Room and a Sunday School room and was heated by steam and had electric lights. Dedicated on October 30, 1910, this is how the Roaring Spring First Church of the Brethren came to be. Stay tuned for



our next moment in our history that shows how quickly the Church attendance grew!

Thanking our local first responders





March's Selection: The Boys from Biloxi by John Grisham


For most of the last hundred years, Biloxi was known for its beaches, resorts, and seafood industry. But it had a darker side. It

was also notorious for corruption and vice, everything from gambling, prostitution, bootleg liquor, and drugs to contract killings. The vice was controlled by small cabal of mobsters, many of them rumored to be members of the Dixie Mafia.

Keith Rudy and Hugh Malco grew up in Biloxi in the sixties and were childhood friends, as well

as Little League all-stars. But as teenagers, their lives took them in different directions. Keith's father became a legendary prosecutor, determined to "clean up the Coast." Hugh's father became the "Boss" of Biloxi's criminal underground. Keith went to law school and followed in his father's footsteps. Hugh preferred the nightlife and worked in his father's clubs. The two families were headed for a showdown, one that would happen in a courtroom.

Life itself hangs in the balance in The Boys from Biloxi, a sweeping saga rich with history and with a large cast of unforgettable characters.

Easter Flower order forms will be available in bulletins and at the Welcome Center in March.


The Church of the Brethren offers nursing scholarships of \$1,000 to \$2,000 for church members who are enrolled in LPN, RN, or nursing graduate programs. A limited number of scholarships are awarded each year. Scholarships of up to \$2,000 for RN and graduate nurse candidates, and up to \$1,000 for LPN candidates, will be awarded. A preference is given to new applications. Also, preference is given to nursing students who are in their second year of an associate's degree or third year of a baccalaureate program.

Scholarship recipients are eligible for only one scholarship per degree. Nominees must be members of the Church of the Brethren.

Applications and supporting documentation must be submitted by April 1. Candidates awarded scholarships will be notified in July and funds will be sent directly to the appropriate school for the fall term.
