


### **Leadership Team Meeting Highlights**

Meeting was held 3-7-23. Next meeting is 4-4-23.

Deacons-Valerie S: The Prayer gatherings continue. At the next Deacon meeting, they will be finalizing plans for Lent.

**CE** - Becky B & Travis R: A children's Easter skit is planned for 3/26/23. VBS materials have been ordered; it will be held at the church this year. Youth participation numbers are currently down. Lent devotionals for adult & children have been made available. There has been a lot of positive feedback about the adult devotional. The children's devotional is the same as last year. A recognition from the CE team is being planned for SS teachers & ReCharge helpers. Children's church will be held on Palm Sunday & Easter Sunday. SS will not be held on Palm Sunday. As well, SS will not be held for children on Easter Sunday; adult classes may individually decide if they want to hold SS or not. It was mentioned that it's great to see all the children upfront for Children's story.



**F&F** – Mike B: Giving is down about \$2000.00 currently. The elevator work should be starting the week after Easter. The church phones are going to be switched over to cellular so they can be used when the power is out, or the internet is down. This will include the elevator phone & church building fire alarm as well. The team has decided to switch the church checking accounts from &T Bank to Altoona First Savings Bank. There was a recent radiator leak in one of the SS rooms on the Nursery level that has been fixed; thank you to several men from the Men's fellowship who helped. The Furnace repair company has suggested that water shut off valves be placed throughout the building. Currently there is not a designated Jr. Youth Advisor for their checking account. F&F has been given permission to operate the account.

**Worship** – Kaye R: Grove City Trombone Choir will provide special music 4/23/23. A new acolyte staff has been ordered.

Pastor Dave: Currently one person getting baptized & 3, possibly 4 transfers on Palm Sunday. He had 3 funerals within the last month. There has been a lot of positive feedback from the recent article that was in the Altoona Mirror regarding the Pastor. Dave thanked everyone for their support. The article is posted on the bulletin board inside the Overflow room. Pictorial directory update: people are encouraged to email family pictures to the office; if they don't have one someone can take a picture for them. The upcoming newsletters will soon include newer family & regular family profiles. Progress work continues on the new web design for the church. The need for child protective clearances for our volunteers is ongoing. This is a mandate from the state, our insurance company, & also from the Middle PA district.

We had some discussion & follow-up clarifications on church recognitions & also on the guidelines for Children's church & Nursery ages. A reminder that our Leadership meetings are the 1st Tuesday of each month unless advised otherwise.






