LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

The meeting was held 5-2-23. Next meeting is 6-27-23 & then on 8-29-23.

Missions & Service – Marlys Hershberger has updated the bulletin board in the Overflow room with Missions & Service opportunities & highlights. Please check it out when you are able. Marlys asked to be able to keep the congregation updated on Church of the Brethren missions with displays, & etc. Permission was granted. There will be 2 kinds of soup offered at Heritage Fair 2023. In addition, they will be selling our traditional gob cake & other homemade baked goods. They will also be doing children's sand art again. The Team has been asked to consider representing our church at this summer's Spring Dam weekend.

Finance & Facility – The building's phone system cannot be updated until the new cellular phone is installed in the renovated elevator due to needing to perform disconnections that need to occur simultaneously with the church's new phone system (which will not be cellular). The elevator company is having difficulty securing some of the necessary parts for the renovations to begin; when those arrive, work should begin immediately. Donations continue to come in for the project's cost. We are approximately \$26,000 short currently. Thanks to a donation of materials & time, there are 2 new water faucets in place in the kitchen. Thank you to all who played a part in making this happen. The A/V has been experiencing some issues on Sundays; work on testings continue. There remains a need for additional technicians & for training.

Hospitality & Communications – There was a nice turnout for the March's 5th Sunday meal; 3 meals were home delivered also. May 5th Ladies Paint Party has 30 persons signed up. Additional May events will include Baby Dedication, & a Carnival to be held at the Albright Church. This Team continues to secure Nursery care for Sunday morning worship time.

Worship – The Grove City College Trombone Choir recently offered a nice program during Sunday morning worship. Dave Imes has stepped down from his faithful volunteering of copying CD/DVD's of the morning worship services & delivering them to those who request them. We thank Dave for his many years of service to this ministry. Terry & Bryce will work with the church office & plan for training & for getting this task completed each week. We were reminded that people who have announcements to share during worship need to use a microphone so that the audio can be picked up for those watching & for the CD/DVD's.

Christian Ed – Continues to work on securing Children's Church leaders for the summer. June 4 worship will include recognition of the SS teachers, CC leaders, & ReCharge leaders. Plans continue for VBS & for Rally Day.

Deacons – Next meeting will be held on May 21. They continue to offer financial support when a need arises.

Pastor's Report – In the summer of 2022, the District offered a "Brethren Faith in Action Grant" for any church in the district who was offering a program that was in some manner reaching out into their community. Pastor Dave applied for a grant to help grow our ReCharge Program. The application was accepted, & we received \$1000 from the District which was used for this past year's Program. The church receiving the grant also had to commit to matching the grant amount with their own church funds. Our ReCharge Program superseded their commitment amount. If you are interested in more information & amazing attendance statistics, please reach out to Pastor Dave for a copy of his report! There will be a dedication for those traveling to work camps during 2023 through the denomination's "Faith X" Program. It will be held during worship on May 21.



Hamburgers, hot dogs, rolls and drínks will be provided.




Hidden in Plain View

In 1993, historian Jacqueline Tobin met African American quilter Ozella Williams amid piles of beautiful handmade quilts in the Old Market Building of Charleston, South Carolina. With the admonition to "write this down," Williams began to describe how slaves made coded quilts and used them to navigate their escape on the Underground Railroad. But just as quickly as she started, Williams stopped, informing Tobin that she would learn the rest when she was "ready."

During the three years it took for Williams's narrative to unfold--and as the friendship and trust between the two women grew--Tobin enlisted Raymond Dobard, Ph.D., an art history professor and well-known African American quilter, to help unravel the mystery.

Part adventure and part history, Hidden in Plain View traces the origin of the Charleston Code from Africa to the Carolinas, from the low-country island Gullah peoples to free blacks living in the cities of the North, and shows how three people from completely different backgrounds pieced together one amazing American story.

Daily Scriptural Themes

Tuesday: Living God's Love, Annual Conference Moderator, Tim McElewee Texts: John 13:34-35, Ephesians 5:1-2, and I John 4:7-12 The call of Christ to love inclusively is both an ethical imperative and the primary means through which Jesus's disciples are known. As imitators of the God who unconditionally loves us, we are called to live God's love.

Wednesday: Bearing the Fruit of God's Love, Sheila Wise Rowe Texts: Mark 12:28-34 and John 15:1-17 A branch cannot bear fruit by itself. For this reason we remain bound and sustained by Christ, the true vine. Through Christ we are able to bear the fruit of loving our neighbors as ourselves.

Thursday: Responding in Love to the Needs of Others, Deanna Brown Texts: Luke 10:25-37 and I John 3:16-24 The Good Samaritan sees a person in need, is moved by mercy, and has the means to help. By showering God's agape love upon on the one in need, the Good Samaritan reveals that the love of God abides in him.

Friday: Seeing and Loving Like God, Jody Romero Texts: Luke 7:36-50 and I Corinthians 13 Until we truly see the outcasts within church and society as God sees them we cannot love as God loves. No matter how gifted and talented we may be, if we do not reflect God's inclusive love we are nothing.

Saturday: Loving the Least in the Family of God, Audri Svay Texts: Matthew 25:31-46 and John 21:15-19 The Greek word, elachistoi, refers to "the least of these," or the "expendables." God through Christ pleads with us to care for, to nurture, and to unconditionally love Jesus's people: the least of these.
