LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

The most recent meeting was held 6-27-23. The next meeting will be on 8-29-23.

Missions & Service: Plans are finalizing for participation in the Spring Dam Weekend on 8-5. We will be offering a sand art craft for children & also have church brochures available. The church has also made a monetary donation. Discussion continues for September's Heritage Fair participation.

Finance & Facility: Giving to date is up slightly from last year. Brief descriptions of SS classes, groups, & recurring events from within the church are needed for the new website. Please get that information to Bryce Nooyen asap if you have been asked to do so.

Hospitality & Communication: The new church brochure has been completed & turned over to F&F for approval & printing. A Craft & Vendor event will be 7-22 at the Albright Church social hall. Proceeds will benefit the Roof Fund. The next 5th Sunday Fellowship Meal will be 7-30. Faith Night at the Curve is 8-13. There will be a movie night at the church on 8-19. The next Hymn Sing will be 9-17.

Christian Ed: The MUM Group will be holding an event in July. Organizational work continues on VBS. The number of upcoming children going into the youth program may warrant splitting the youth back into Jr. & Sr. Youth Groups again. Discussion began on finding ways to meet the needs of our Post High School (PHS) attendees. The Leadership Team approved suspending the current Youth Guidelines for 1 year to permit PHS

persons to attend Sr. Youth SS, Bible studies, & some social events. The CE Team will also work with several interested PHS people to help empower them to become leaders for their group. Rally Day plans continue. There is a need for some SS classes to relocate. Work continues on securing SS teachers for fall. Children's Church is also in need of a larger gathering space.

Worship: The church's CCLI licensing has been upgraded so that we are now able to stream videos during worship. The order of worship has been reworked in recent weeks & seems to be working out well.

Deacons: In person prayer gatherings have been suspended for the summer. Prayer time will continue via email & texting until fall. In pew communion will be held on 7-16. The next Deacon Meeting will be held on 9-17 & communion bread will be made on 9-26.

Pastor's Report: Marlys Hershberger has been asked to share with the congregation about her recent Faith X trip to Spain. The pastor will again be applying to the denomination for a financial grant to aid with our ReCharge Program. Pastor Dave has some photos that have been submitted to him for the upcoming in-house pictorial directory. He will begin to work on assembling it when the office's new software is completely installed.

District Conference Delegates will be registered by the church office for inperson attendance. It will be held 10-14 at the Hollidaysburg Church. Those attending will be Pastor Dave, Kaye Russell, Bonnie Butler, Sandy Norris, & Paul Witkovsky.



Meetings are the third Monday of each month at 10 am in the Parlor. Join us as we discuss the monthly selection on August 21st.


I Will Find You by Harlan Coben


