Living out our faith

Being the hands and feet of Jesus, serving with open minds and hearts.

We exist to be a community of welcome and worship where people find peace, purpose, and power through Jesus Christ.

The first Sunday in October has come to be recognized in some churches and denominations as "World Wide Communion Sunday." As has become our practice here at First Church, we will be celebrating this opportunity to focus on drawing close to God beginning at 6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall.

As important as it is to take advantage of such chances to move closer to God, this event also stands as a reminder of the Lord and Savior we have in common with other "World-wide" denominations. In other words, it is also a reminder that we have many Brothers and Sisters in faith, even if we do not always see eye to eye with them on every "disputable matter" (as Romans 14 identifies the things which sometimes divide us.)

But Love Feast and Communion is even more than that. This event is also our chance to demonstrate, celebrate and strengthen our own unity, our own willingness to work together as a church family.

Each of the four parts of Love Feast can contribute to this strengthening of the "Tie That Binds." When we take the time to invest in self-preparation, we are focusing on where we stand with each other and identifying areas of needed reconciliation and forgiveness.

The Feet-washing gives us a powerful symbol that demonstrates how we act within the community, as does the Agape Meal. You don't need me to tell you how communities and families like to sit down to a meal together! And finally, the Bread and the Cup allow us to share with each other in drawing close to the Author and Finisher of our faith-Jesus Christ.

In the middle of your busy schedules, please consider participating in our Love Feast and Communion as part of World-Wide Communion Sunday on October 1. Not only will it help you draw closer to God, but it will also enable you to be part of the World-Wide church, and will strengthen your bonds within our own church!



LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT The most recent meeting was held 8-29-23. The next meeting will be on 10-5-23.

Worship: Choir practice began the week of 8-30-23 and will be singing on Rally Day, 9-10-23. A small band has been reorganized and will be sharing special music periodically. Sound system issues were discussed. Those wishing a CD or DVD of the morning worship services should contact Kaye Russell and one will be made available.

Missions & Service: Work continues for Heritage Fair, 9-16-23 at CBD. Our booth at the recent Spring Dam Weekend was well received by the community.

Hospitality & Communications: The recent fundraiser vendor show held at the Albright Church was a success. Approximately \$1000 was raised for the roof fund. A donation was given to the Albright Church for the use of their facility. Additional events being sponsored by this Team continue through the end of the year. Watch for announcements!

Christian Education: Rally Day plans are complete; The Mr. & Mrs. Class has designed a new name for their Sunday School Class – they are now called the Living Faith Class. Some SS classes have outgrown their SS rooms, so some shifting of classrooms was necessary. Look for information in the bulletins and on the classroom doors. The 3-day VBS in our church was very well accepted by both children and helpers. ReCharge will begin on 10-4-23.

Finance & Facility: The phones in the church seem to be working more effectively since some upgrades to the

lines were performed by Breezeline. If you still have difficulty reaching the church office, please let Bryce Nooyen know. Work on upgrades to the elevator will begin on 9-18-23 and will take approximately 2 weeks. The elevator will not be useable during that period. A new church brochure will be completed and printed within the next week as will the new website. All church accounts have been closed at M&T Bank and opened at Altoona First Savings & Loan. Elevator fund is currently at approximately \$34,000.

Deacons: Next meeting is 9-17-23. Communion bread making, Love Feast, & Deacon calling are all coming up before the end of this year. Communion bread will be donated to CBD for a "best tasting competition" to be held at Heritage Fair as a fundraiser.

Pastor Dave: The District is for the 2nd year, providing us with a \$1000 grant to be used for our ReCharge Program. There may be a fall baptism offered; date, time, and location TBD.

Thank you to Roots in the Cove for cleaning up the landscapes and for donating the fresh mulch.

The History Group will be asked to make a poster for our District Conference Delegates to share at the Conference on 10-14-23.

Gifts Discernment Team has been working on preparing the slate for the 11-19-23 Congregational Forum.

Teams will be working on their 2024 budget projections beginning 9-15-23. Please be in prayer for them as they discern to the best of their abilities how to continue the work of Jesus within our financial means.






Meetings are the third Monday of each month at 10 am in the Parlor. Join us as we discuss the monthly selection October 16th.

"The Sweetness of Water" by Nathan Harris

In the waning days of the Civil War, brothers Prentiss and Landry—freed by the Emancipation Proclamation—seek refuge on the homestead of George Walker and his wife, Isabelle. The

Walkers, wracked by the loss of their only son to the war, hire the brothers to work their farm, hoping through an unexpected friendship to stanch their grief. Prentiss and Landry, meanwhile, plan to save money for the journey north and a chance to reunite with their mother, who was sold away when they were boys.

Parallel to their story runs a forbidden romance between two Confederate soldiers. The young men, recently returned from the war to the town of Old Ox, hold their trysts in the woods. But when their secret is discovered, the resulting chaos, including a murder, unleashes convulsive repercussions on the entire community. In the aftermath of so much turmoil, it is Isabelle who emerges as an unlikely leader, proffering a healing vision for the land and for the newly free citizens of Old Ox.
