So, if you haven't decided on any improvements you need in your life, may I be so bold as to suggest one possible resolution that ALL of us need?


Why not make a commitment to grow closer to God in the coming year?

LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Leadership Team met on 10-31-23. The next meeting will be held on 12-5-23.

Worship: Elementary children shared in the worship service on 10-29. The youth presented worship on 11-5 as a part of the Church of the Brethren Jr. Youth Sunday. On 11-12 there was a special emphasis on the Ladies Aide of our church and a display of several quilts were in the Overflow Room. On 11-26 there will be a segment of worship dedicated to those who have lost loved ones and wish to recognize them as part of a "Blue Christmas" service.

Missions & Service: Heritage Fair collected \$26,000. Pennies for Witness from our church totaled \$640. We are to be commended for our generous giving to this outreach. It was noted that all budgeted outreach for 2023 will be paid. Our annual White Gift offering opportunity will be held during December. This helps to meet our end of year budgeted obligations.

Christian Education: The team is working on ordering Adult Advent Booklets. Hospitality & Communications: Donations for the Truck or Treat event made a total of 268 goodie bags. Thank you for your donations! In addition to sharing them at the T or T event, children and adults were also given bags at a recent ReCharge. Upcoming events include the Older Servants Dinner; a Paint Party; a Hymn Sing; and a 5th Sunday lunch to wrap up the year!

Finance & Facility: Waiting for state inspection to be completed on the elevator revamp. Roof drain repairs will begin soon by Mid-State Roofing. Attendance and giving are both steady; thank you for your commitment to both. The church's computer software has been switched over to "Church 360". Most of the employed staff and the financial secretary have been trained and are liking the added perks of the new program. The church office phones will soon be able to be switched over to Microsoft VOIP. This will occur once the elevator work is complete, and the elevator phone is accessible. The new website is up and working well; it just needs some continued tweaking and the addition of photos of the church's events. Please share what you have with the church office via email. To date, the History Team has provided some interesting photos. Brass handrails will soon be installed at the steps coming off the Overflow Room into the sanctuary for added safety. Other areas of the building will also be accessed for better safety features. An updated map of the church building is also a work in progress. A bathroom plumbing issue was recently resolved.

Deacons: In person prayer gatherings continue the first and third Sundays of each month. The team provided the meal at the 10-25 ReCharge. We are in the midst of a deacon calling.

Pastor Dave: He appreciates all the support he receives from the Leadership Team and the congregation. He continues working on the photo directory and hopes to have it available by the first of the new year. He will be asking for volunteers to light the Advent candles during worship.

~~The church has always provided the curriculums needed for our Sunday School Program. Extra items for classrooms, however, are at the expense of each class.

~~2 new sets of exterior metal doors are needed in the Fellowship Hall. These will be added to the current "wish list"! 2 of the other items F&F mentioned as needing replaced include new Plexiglas for the stained-glass windows and new chairs for the Fellowship Hall.

~~The Leadership Team approved the agenda for the upcoming Forum, the slates, and the 2024 proposed budget. It was noted that both the Middle PA District and the Brethren Denomination are both struggling financially. It is suggested that individuals make personal contributions, if able, to either of these to aid in their ability to continue their ministries and budget expenses.

LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Leadership Team met on 12-5-23. The next meeting will be held on 1-2-24.

Kaye Russell expressed her gratitude to all 2023 LT members. The church is beginning to pick itself back up for the several years of COVID setbacks. We are all working intently to bring the vitality of our congregation back and it is working well. We have a considerable number of activity options available once again to bring the children, youth and adults from our congregation and our community closer to God.

Worship: Tree lights will be placed on the two artificial trees behind the choir loft.

Missions & Service: All committed 2023 outreach has been paid. Year end monetary gifts will be given to the RS Library, Blair Family Services, three local food banks, and the SCSD Backpack Program. White Gift will be shared with Brethren Disaster Ministry Emergency Fund and the Middle PA District budget. The Giving Tree will accept food donations for the three local food banks.

Christian Education: Children's SS will not be held on 12-24 or 12-31. Adult classes can decide on their own if they choose to meet or not meet. Nursery care during worship was discussed.

Hospitality & Communications: 5th Sunday luncheon for 12-31 has been cancelled. 2024 calendar of events has been compiled.

Finance & Facility: The elevator updates are complete and have been inspected by the state. One final weight limit inspection is scheduled. There has been some offering submitted through the new website's donation option. Donations were received to replace the wooden exterior doors in the Fellowship Hall. Thank you to those who are making this upgrade possible. Spotlights have been added to the signs in the front of the church building for better nighttime viewing. Men's Fellowship was granted permission to store a propane heater in the Ladies Aid Room following their pre-worship outdoor meet and greet time during the winter months. Paul Witkovsky will ask the Lady quilters for their permission. Off season, the heater will be stored off premises. A new dusk to dawn light timer and LED bulb will be installed for the parking lot. There are continuing concerns with the daycare that is housed in our building. Discussion continues.

Deacons: Deacons assisted with congregational anointing during worship on 11-26. Six deacons were recently recalled. Installation of 5 and 1 emeritus recognition will be held on 1-7-24 along with in pew communion. Hallway mailboxes will be updated. Christmas gift bags for delivery will be ready for pick up on 12-14 by Shepherds.

Pastor Dave: Preliminary pictorial directory continues through the end of the year to circulate for members and friends to approve their photo and information. Jan Simington will be on vacation from 12-21 through 1-1-24. Pastor Dave and Terry Hershberger will be covering the office and answering the phones.

LT has been asked to aid the History Team with bringing recorded history highlights up to date from 2010. Requests of the congregation to assist in gathering old church records will be in upcoming bulletins.

A list of Hanging of the Greens annual group responsibilities has been developed and will be distributed in January.

Discussion on wording in the Constitution regarding forum packets and slate affirmations was reviewed. Changes will be made for the 2024 fall forum. Forum minutes will appear in newsletters that follow as well as become part of the next forum packet.

There were not enough paper slates available for all members for the 12-10 slate affirmations, so additional papers will be offered on 12-0 for those who were not able to complete one on 12-3. After all slates have been collected, a determination of total affirmation counts can be made.

"The Keeper of Hidden Books" By Madeline Martin

All her life, Zofia has found comfort in two things during times of hardship: books and her best friend, Janina. But no one could have imagined the horrors of the Nazi occupation in Warsaw. As the bombs rain down and Hitler's forces loot and destroy the city, Zofia finds that now books are also in need of saving.

With the death count rising and persecution intensifying, Zofia jumps to action to save her friend and salvage whatever books she can from the wreckage, hiding them away, and even starting a clandestine book club. She and her dearest friend never surrender their love of reading, even when Janina is

forced into the newly formed ghetto.

But the closer Warsaw creeps toward liberation, the more dangerous life becomes for the women and their families—and escape may not be possible for everyone. As the destruction rages around them, Zofia must fight to save her friend and preserve her culture and community using the only weapon they have left—literature.
