We exist to be a community of welcome and worship where people find peace, purpose, and power through Jesus Christ.



LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Leadership Team met on 1-3-2024. The next meeting will be held on 2-6-2024.

Worship: Organ maintenance has been completed. The Souper Bowl of Caring will be held on Sunday, 2-4-2024. Terry will be away for several Sundays this winter as he works with Brethren Disaster Ministries for training.

Missions & Service: Marlys has reached out to introduce herself to the three local food banks: Roaring Spring, Claysburg, and Martinsburg.

Christian Education: Stephen Hershberger is getting to know the Team responsibilities and is getting his Team members in place. They will be focusing on using more children and youth during worship.

Hospitality & Communications: A list of 2024 events was provided. A bowling party will be held at the MC Park on Saturday, 2-10-2024.

Finance & Facility: Bryce checked in with the denomination about our church's desire to use a newly designed church logo with a Dove; the denomination office was more than pleased with our new design and was grateful for our reaching out to them. Discussion was also held on our church's formal use of the word "The" before our church's name. It is not on our charter paperwork. LT has decided to display our name formally as Roaring Spring First Church of the Brethren until this can be further discussed at the next Forum. The outside parking lot lighting has been updated and is on a dusk to dawn setting. New FH steel exterior doors have been ordered and will be installed upon receiving.

Deacons: fifty gift bags were distributed at Christmas time by Under-shepherds. Mailbox assignments and the Under-shepherd Program will be discussed at the Sunday, 1-21-2024 meeting.

Pastor Dave: The annual Church Directory will be part of the upcoming Pictorial Directory. At this early stage, Palm Sunday, 3-24-2024 will include four baptisms and six transfers.

Children's worship activity bags will be evaluated and restocked as necessary by the CE Team.

Annual Church Directory information found on pages 8-9 will be reviewed by LT Chairs, and contacts will be made with volunteers to see if they will continue to serve in 2024.

There will be a LT Retreat on Saturday, 1-27-2024 from 9-11:30am in the Fellowship Hall. Team members for 2024 are encouraged to attend with their Team chair. Questions should be directed to their chair, or to Kaye Russell.


Our church's administration is operated through a structure which the Brethren denomination developed some years ago and calls it a "Leadership Team" concept. Another term which some Brethren churches still use is "The Church Board". The members of the 2024 Leadership Team include: Chairperson-Kaye Russell; Vice Chairperson-Paul Witkovsky; Pastor-David Crumrine; Church Clerk-Valerie Smith; Church Moderator-Dan Hammel; Deacon Chairpersons-Dave & Valerie Smith; Christian Ed Core Team Chair-Stephen Hershberger; Finance & Facility Core Team

Chair-Bryce Nooyen; Hospitality & Communications Core Team Chair-Beth Burns; Missions & Service Core Team Chair-Marlys Hershberger; & Music & Worship Core Team Chair-Terry Hershberger. Each Core Team chair is responsible for securing 3-4 active attendees to serve a 1 or more year commitment on their team.

In addition to the Leadership Team there is a "Leadership Executive Team" which may still be tagged in some congregations as the "Church Executive Committee". This Team is made up of the Leadership Team Chair, Vice-Chair, Pastor, Church Clerk, Moderator, & 1 of the 5 Core Team Chairs as chosen by the Leadership Team.

This form of administration and leadership has been a good transition for First Church.

All the Sinners Bleed by S. A. Cosby


Titus Crown is the first Black sheriff in the history of Charon County, Virginia. In recent decades, quiet Charon has had only two murders. But after years of working as an FBI agent, Titus knows better than anyone that while his hometown might seem like a land of moonshine, cornbread, and honeysuckle, secrets always fester under the surface.

Then a year to the day after Titus's election, a school teacher is killed by a former student and the student is

fatally shot by Titus's deputies. As Titus investigates the shootings, he unearths terrible crimes and a serial killer who has been hiding in plain sight, haunting the dirt lanes and woodland clearings of Charon.

With the killer's possible connections to a local church and the town's harrowing history weighing on him, Titus projects confidence about closing the case while concealing a painful secret from his own past. At the same time, he also has to contend with a far-right group that wants to hold a parade in celebration of the town's Confederate history.

Charon is Titus's home and his heart. But where faith and violence meet, there will be a reckoning.

This year, Ash Wednesday takes place on Wednesday, February 14, 2024, coinciding with Valentine's Day.

If you're familiar with Ash Wednesday—also known as the Day of Ashes—then you know that every year, people receive dark ash marks on their foreheads in the sign of a cross. Even if you're not familiar with getting ashes, you've probably seen people walking around the grocery store or your office on Ash Wednesday displaying these black streaks.

What's the reason behind the ashes and why are they given on this day?

The ashes are meant to symbolize both death and repentance in order to begin Lent in a solemn, humble way. This is said to allow people to reflect on their sins throughout Lent before Easter, when Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

Most churches use palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday service to create the ash. When Christians receive ashes, the priest or pastor says, "From dust you came and from dust you will return."

Ash Wednesday is the start of the Easter season as it marks the beginning of Lent. Though the day itself is not mentioned in the Bible, ashes are often used as a symbol of sorrow for sin in the Bible. Because Lent is a time for fasting, self-sacrifice, and repentance, it makes sense to begin the 40-day period with a symbolic gesture of solemnity.

Lent is a time of reflection and self-examination, where Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, and spiritual discipline. Many people give something up for Lent, but I challenge you instead to take up something (a start to a good habit) instead. Here are some ideas for things to take up for Lent 2024:

- 1. **Daily prayer**: Set aside time each day to pray and meditate on scripture.
- 2. **Fasting**: Give up a favorite food or drink for the duration of Lent.
- 3. Charitable giving: Donate to a charity or volunteer at a local organization.
- 4. Random acts of kindness: Perform a kind deed for someone each day.
- 5. **Journaling**: Write down your thoughts and feelings each day.
- 6. **Reading**: Read a spiritual book or devotional each day.
- 7. Forgiveness: Forgive someone who has wronged you.
- 8. **Gratitude**: Write down something you are grateful for each day.
- 9. **Simplicity**: Simplify your life by decluttering your home or workspace.
- 10. Silence: Spend time in silence each day to reflect on your thoughts and feelings.

These are just a few ideas to get you started. Remember, the goal of Lent is to grow closer to God and to become a better version of yourself. Choose something that challenges you and helps you to focus on your spiritual journey.



History Team Statement of Purpose

The Church History Team is responsible for the collection, preservation, interpreting and exhibiting both tangible and intangible heritage of the Roaring Spring First Church of the Brethren for the purpose of keeping alive our institutional history and its place in the Brethren community.

In performing this responsibility team members maintain the History and Research Center on the Church second floor, In addition the team periodically informs the congregation of different aspects of our history and takes action when appropriate to update that history..

In 2013 we--

- Gathered and published biographical sketches of each of our pastors documenting their work as a Brethren minister in our church and elsewhere.
- Organized and made available to church members books, brochures, reports, papers and videos regarding our church history.
- Displayed exhibits of our history, most recently a photograph of our church circa 1909.
- Provided a quiet room for meditation, prayer and research.
- Supported the pastor with visual highlights for presentation at a Mid Atlantic District meeting
- Discovered a formal county agreement in old church papers taxing our auxiliary parking lot., Bryce Nooyen met with County officials who agreed to eliminate the tax.


