HOSPITALITY & COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

Over seventy children participated in the recent Easter Egg hunt and party. Thanks to all those who were able to donate items to make this event a success for the children. There will be a baby dedication on 5-9-24. The 2ndAnnual Community Carnival Day will be hosted by our church at the Albright Church on 5-18-24. Tom Holsinger was thanked for serving as choir director during Terry Hershberger's recent time away. An Impact Team has been formed to pursue looking at some changes to the seating in the choir loft.

MISSIONS & SERVICE TEAM

Thirty-eight people from our congregation recently helped with the community UNTO outreach project. Over 15,000 bags of rice and beans were bagged and made ready to be sent to locations throughout the world where there is a need for food. The team will be sponsoring a "clean up bucket" service project for Church World Service during May and June. Flyers with detailed information will be available soon. A sample bucket can be seen in the Overflow Room.

FINANCE & FACILITY TEAM

The Parsonage replenishment fund is at approximately \$13,000. Please continue to make donations to the Elevator Fund as you are able in order to pay back the Parsonage fund in full. Donation envelopes are located in the Overflow Room. The roof drains that were to have been replaced were not able to be replaced but have been sealed; there have not been any new leaks to date. This is just a band aid that will buy us several years with the current roof and drains. A telephone device has been ordered for in the elevator with the hope that it will be workable inside the elevator. It was clarified that any information given to the church office for a newsletter is then given monthly to IMPEL Web Design for insertion onto our website and Facebook. Other information that you wish to have added throughout the month needs to be given to Bryce Nooyen. and their family accept and find comfort in knowing it's ok to die because our Lord is waiting for us on the other side of this life is what she was put here for.







Missions & Service Team Highlights – CHURCH WORLD SERVICE



Church World Service (CWS) was born in the wake of the devastation of World War II. The Church of the Brethren joined with 16 other Christian denominations "to do in partnership what none of us could hope to do as well alone." While we in the Church of the Brethren also engage in our own special projects, we

continue to partner with CWS in order to maximize our service to people in need in the U.S. and around the world in the name and spirit of Jesus Christ.

Our congregation's Missions & Service Team is leading us in a service project – creating CWS EMERGENCY CLEAN UP BUCKETS – time-proven to be a help in crisis.

Hurricanes, floods, fires, and other disasters are happening more frequently. When our neighbors around the world experience these unforeseen circumstances, we can make the road to recovery easier with CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets. These buckets are full of essential home recovery supplies that are needed after a disaster strikes.



In the months of May and June we are encouraging individuals, families, and friends to come together in small groups and create CWS Emergency Cleanup Kits. There are assembly checklist directions and a sample bucket in the Overflow Room. There is also a video showing cleanup bucket assembly at <u>cwskits.org/resources/</u>. Bring completed emergency cleanup buckets to the Overflow Room by the deadline date of June 30.

A completed bucket costs \$75-100. This is why we have chosen this project: **This is a valuable project that many individuals would not take on alone yet can be achieved when we come together as a faith community, as the body of Christ.** M&S Team has already purchased 22 buckets and lids for your use—first come, first serve. They are available in the Overflow Room.

CWS requests that we give \$3/bucket as a processing/shipping fee. Please place \$3 in an envelope and attach it to the outside of the bucket. If you prefer to give money towards this project to create CWS cleanup buckets, please contact a M&S Team member. Or place your money in an envelope, with a note, in the offering plate.
