You know when it gets hot outside that the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference is about to take place!

The denomination will hold our 237th recorded conference July 3-7 in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

For those not familiar with our structure and mode of operation, Annual Conference is where delegates from individual churches around the country come together to worship, to renew friendships with others from around the country in our church family, and to make the decisions that generally govern church practice, policy and polity

"Welcome and Worthy" is the theme for this year's conference, as selected by Moderator Madalyn Metzger of Goshen, Indiana.

Unfinished business not completed from early conferences includes a discussion of a query related to "Standing of People of Color" and one of "Breaking Down Barriers- Increasing Access to Denominational Events." Another unfinished business item to be discussed is a "Request for an Annual Conference Study on Calling Denominational Leadership."

New business items for delegate consideration include addressing the Denominational Review and Evaluation Committee, House Equity Fund Recommendations for Pastors, a query examining "A New Model of Denominational Structure," a proposed Memorandum of Understanding Updating Policy for Bethany Theological Seminary," a proposed update of polity related to On Earth Peace and the yearly recommended Cost of Living Adjustment to the minimum cash salary table for Pastors.

Please be in prayer for our denomination, and for our delegates – Paul Witkovsky and Pastor Dave – as they travel to Michigan and represent us in the discussions and voting.

• The Leadership Team met on 6-4-2024. The next meeting will be held on 8-6-2024.

CHRISTIAN ED TEAM

Discussion continues within this team regarding fall SS teachers, curriculums, and post Sr. High Class. Rally Day will be 9-8 with a Western theme of "Roundup Sunday"! Old SS materials have been donated to Cove Forge, Williamsburg, PA.

HOSPITALITY & COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

A 5th Sunday lunch will be held on 6-30 following the SS hour; all are invited to attend; sign-up sheets are located at the Welcome Center. Plans continue for the "Christmas in July" vendor event to be held on 7-20 at the Albright CoB. "Faith Night" at the Curve is 8-19; a sign-up sheet will become available at the Welcome Center. Tickets will be \$10.00.

WORSHIP TEAM

New Choir loft chairs have been ordered. Terry H. and Pastor Dave will begin working on an A/V notebook with instructions and photos on how to operate the church's systems. Perhaps more people might then find interest in serving in this ministry.

MISSIONS & SERVICE TEAM

The all-church CWS Clean up Buckets service project will end on June 30. A children's craft booth will be set up at the Spring Dam on 8-3 for RS Community Day. We will be offering free sand art. Discussions around fall 2024 Heritage Fair have begun. More definite planning will begin in July.

FINANCE & FACILITY TEAM

Worship attendance continues to be higher than a year ago. A piece of white pipe at the sight of a roof drain has broken; it will be repaired soon. The FH floor has recently been waxed. Thanks to Jan Claar for preparing the Hall for the project. The new phone line transfer is progressing with the new system working as expected. A longer analog phone cable is needed to complete the installation of the phone in the elevator; the project will be completed as soon as possible.

DEACON'S REPORT

Church attendee mailboxes and Under shepherd Lists will be reviewed and updated quarterly. In-Pew Communion will be held this summer with a date yet TBD. An ongoing discussion continues to be held between the Deacons and the LT for the best means of providing the church building's safety during morning worship. Outside recommendations will be sought. Deacons will not hold any meetings over the summer but will have email prayer time the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Three summer baptisms have been requested as well as two membership transfers: dates TBD. Tuesday morning Bible Study continues to be very well attended and the Wednesday evening Zoom group has 6-8 participants. He will be leading summer SS for Youth and Adults beginning 6-16.

- Occasional Wednesday evening and Sunday afternoon worship services have started up again at the Village at MC. Churches have been invited by the new part-time chaplain to begin participating. Pastor Dave will look into the options further.
- Pastor Dave plans to attend Annual Conference but uncharacteristically, Dawn will not be
 accompanying him this year. Their daughter and son-in-law are expecting their second son within the
 next several weeks. LT has granted the pastor leniency in not attending Conference this year due to the
 arrival of his new grandson, should he choose to remain at home.
- LT meeting for 7-2 has been cancelled; if there are any issues or concerns, please reach out to Kaye Russell.





The Berry Pickers by Amanda Peters

A four-year-old Mi'kmaq girl goes missing from the blueberry fields of Maine, sparking a tragic mystery that haunts the survivors, unravels a community, and remains unsolved for nearly fifty years.

July 1962. A Mi'kmaq family from Nova Scotia arrives in Maine to pick blueberries for the summer. Weeks later, four-year-old Ruthie, the family's youngest child, vanishes. She is last seen by her six-year-old brother, Joe, sitting on a favorite rock at the edge of a berry field. Joe will remain distraught by his sister's disappearance for years to come.

In Maine, a young girl named Norma grows up as the only child of an affluent family. Her father is emotionally distant, her mother frustratingly overprotective. Norma is often troubled by recurring dreams and visions that seem more like memories than imagination. As she grows older, Norma slowly comes to realize there is something her parents aren't telling her. Unwilling to abandon her intuition, she will spend decades trying to uncover this family secret.

Missions & Service Team Highlights - Local Food Pantries

James 2:14-17: What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

Food insecurity is a huge issue throughout the United States. Local food pantries provide food assistance to individuals and families in need. Our local pantries also provide hygiene products and some cleaning supplies. This assistance allows people who are struggling with poverty to secure a healthy variety of foods as well as save money for other expenses. Each pantry serves a specific geographic area and maintains a client list to help manage their resources wisely.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Our congregation regularly collects donations of non-perishable foods for the Roaring Spring and Claysburg Food Pantries and occasionally gives monetary donations to these pantries and Martinsburg Food Pantry. We also put out food and, especially, hygiene items in the white Blessing Box outside our building, located near the street on the parking lot side. These items are available to anyone who feels a need. We prioritize hygiene items since Faith United Methodist Church maintains a Porch Food Pantry with food items.

FOOD PANTRY DONATIONS: You can donate non-perishable food items for the food pantries any time, placing them in the large blue barrel outside the elevator on the main, sanctuary level. We deliver these donations to pantries once a month.

BLESSING BOX DONATIONS: You can donate hygiene items and basic cleaning supplies, as well as food items, to our congregation's Blessing Box, placing items in the bins located just inside the door of the Alpha Classroom. This is the room next to the Church Office's hallway door. We prefer that you not place items in the Blessing Box itself since there are volunteers who monitor the Blessing Box supplies.
