Meetings are the third Monday of each month at 10 am in the Parlor. Join us as we discuss the monthly selection on March 18, 2024


The House We Grew Up In by Lisa Jewell

In the church budget of Roaring Spring First Church of the Brethren, we designate funds to support Bethany Theological Seminary and the Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center, as well as our Middle PA District which also provides educational growth opportunities.



Bethany Theological Seminary was founded in 1905. Now located in Richmond, Indiana, the main campus serves as a hub for students who take





courses online, on-site and in a variety of other collaborative settings. Steven Schweitzer, Academic Dean and Professor, says: "At Bethany, we learn, grow, and serve in community. We value our Brethren heritage and the rich biblical and theological streams that have shaped us. We hope that our teaching and research open up new possibilities for students and the church as we live into the future to which God is calling us."



Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center

SVMC's mission is "to equip leaders for ministry in a regionally based, Christ centered, culturally relevant context in ways that bear witness to the beliefs, heritage, and practices of the Church of the Brethren." Housed at Elizabethtown College since its inception in 1993, Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center delivers training and

continuing education for Church of the Brethren ministry and lay leadership. SVMC offers classes in the ACTS and TRIM certificate programs, hosts graduate courses for Bethany Theological seminary, and organizes continuing education events. SVMC works in close partnership with Bethany Theological Seminary, Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership, and five Church of the Brethren districts: Atlantic Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, and Middle, Southern, and Western Pennsylvania.

Following Christ

What you need:

- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



What you do:

- Measure flour into the large bowl.
 Add baby oil.
- Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- 3. The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- 4. Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.
