
Meetings are the third Monday of each month at 10 am in the Parlor. Join us as we discuss the monthly selection on September 15, 2025.



Middle District Updates

Who's Ready for Punkin' Chunkin'? Make your device and bring it to Heritage Fair. Register for the contest at the Everett Church of the Brethren booth. Contests start at 2:00 p.m. \$10.00 entry fee payable at registration

Peeps Punkin Chunkin Rules

Individual/team will launch marshmallow "Peeps" pumpkins using a device they have made and brought to the festival.

There will be categories for Trebuchet and Catapult

There will be two age divisions – 12 and under and 13 and over

Devices must fit in a 2 foot by 2 foot footprint with a throwing arm no longer than 3 feet.

Counterweight for trebuchet must be no heavier than one person on the team can set.

Torsion band for catapult must be able to be set by one person on the team

Distance will be measured from the starting line to the point the "peep" pumpkin first touches the ground.

Each device will have 2 chances to launch. Best distance will be counted for awards. If the device crosses the start line during launching, that launch will be disqualified. Decision of the judge is final.

"Peeps" for the contest will be provided. No alterations to the marshmallow pumpkins will be permitted.
