#### Living out our faith

Being the hands and feet of Jesus, serving with open minds and hearts.

We exist to be a community of welcome and worship where people find peace, purpose, and power through Jesus Christ.

Recently the Wednesday evening on-line Bible Study group came upon one of those verses that, at least for me, has made be stop, pray, and think much about the idea being presented.

In his letter to Philemon, Paul addresses the issue of the runaway slave Onessius. After running away from his master Philemon, Onessius somehow found his way to Rome where he became a close friend and helper to Paul. Paul is writing to the original owner, telling him that he will be sending the now-Christian slave back to his Christian owner, hoping for forgiveness and positive treatment for him.

So, here's the principle that I find myself thinking about again and again:

#### Philemon 8

8 "Therefore, although in Christ I could be bold and order you to do what you ought to do, 9 yet I prefer to appeal to you on the basis of love."

Doesn't that sound 100%, through and through Brethren to you? God could tell us we HAVE to. The Church could tell us we MUST. Jesus could say "You'd better, or ELSE."

But we follow Christ, not because we HAVE to. But because we WANT to. We want to follow Him because of the love he first shared with us.

The fact that it was a slave facing this hard choice somehow makes our efforts to follow Him even more dramatic. We all have tough decisions to make daily, but because we WANT to follow Him out of love we can come through the difficult times those choices cause.



## Beneath a Scarlet Sky by Mark Sullivan

Pino Lella wants nothing to do with the war or the Nazis. He's a normal Italian teenager—obsessed with music, food, and girls—but his days of innocence are numbered. When his family home in Milan is destroyed by Allied bombs, Pino joins an underground railroad helping Jews escape over the Alps, and falls for Anna, a beautiful widow six years his senior.

In an attempt to protect him, Pino's parents force him to enlist as a German soldier—a move they think will keep him out of combat. But after Pino is injured, he is recruited at the tender age of eighteen to become the personal driver for Adolf Hitler's left hand in Italy, General Hans Leyers, one of the Third Reich's most mysterious and powerful commanders.

Now, with the opportunity to spy for the Allies inside the German High Command, Pino endures the horrors of the war and the Nazi occupation by fighting in secret, his courage bolstered by his love for Anna and for the life he dreams they will one day share.






## Youth Volleyball Tournament
