I Samuel 7:12 tells us that after a miraculous victory over the Philistines....

"Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen.

He named it Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us.""

Evidently, the name comes from a Hebrew word meaning "stone of help." So, when the classic hymn "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" sings "Here I raise my Ebenezer. Hither by thy help I've come" what we're doing is expressing gratitude for all that God has done for us.

Of course, November is the month of Thanksgiving, a time traditionally set aside to get us to focus on our many blessings. But we don't have to wait just for this month, or just for that holiday.

Rather, every day can be an Ebenezer to God as we think about all that He has done, is doing and will do to help us and to bless us. Making every day an Ebenezer has many benefits, not least of which is that gratitude draws us closer to God (Psalm 22:3)

So. Let's resolve to make gratitude a daily habit. Let "Bah, Humbug" behind as characteristic of this world, while we make raising an Ebenezer in praise of our Lord and Savior part of our Christian world view.



In the halcyon past, Domenica Cabrelli thrives in the coastal town of Viareggio until her beloved home becomes unsafe when Italy teeters on the brink of World War II. Her journey takes her from the rocky shores of Marseille to the mystical beauty of Scotland to the dangers of wartime Liverpool--where Italian Scots are imprisoned without cause--as Domenica experiences love, loss, and grief while she longs for home. A hundred years later, her daughter, Matelda, and her granddaughter, Anina, face the same big questions about life and their family's legacy, while Matelda contemplates what is worth fighting for. But Matelda is running out of time, and the two timelines intersect and weave together in unexpected and heartbreaking ways that lead the family to shocking revelations and, ultimately, redemption.

## Board 101

Saturday, November 15, 2025 9:30 to 11:30 am Roaring Spring Church of the Brethren

Have you been asked to serve on your church board? Are you already serving in that capacity? This two-hour workshop will give you some practical tools to fulfill that role.

Serving on a church board is not "business as usual." Yes, there are legal responsibilities and best business practices that serving on your church board entails, however, it is also "worshipful work."

This workshop will cover both of those aspects: first, that being a board member of a church is an important role full of legal responsibilities, with tasks and expectations unique to that position, along with practical steps that you can take to minimize risk and maximize protection for your church.

Second, we will discuss the fact that serving in any capacity in the church is a calling, sacred and holy. We are called to offer before God all that defines us and is important to us – including serving on the church board. How do we integrate these two sometimes dichotomous roles into one efficient board? How do we marry the legal and business aspects of serving on a church board with the evangelical and theological aspects?

As part of our ongoing series of workshops and classes focused on equipping lay leaders for serving our church effectively in the future, the Middle Pennsylvania District of the Church of the Brethren is offering "Board 101" on Saturday, November 15 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at Roaring Spring Church of the Brethren, 901 Bloomfield St., Roaring Spring, PA.

The workshop will be led by Eder Financial President Nevin Dulabaum. There is no charge to attend, but churches sending congregation members to the session are encouraged to make a free-will offering to cover expenses.
