



Happiness Falls by Angie Kim

"Happiness Falls" is a gripping novel that explores the complexities of family dynamics, communication, and the search for happiness through the lens of a Korean American family facing a crisis when their father goes missing.

The story centers around the Parkson family, particularly focusing on Mia, a 20-year-old college student, and her nonverbal brother, Eugene, who has Angelman Syndrome. The narrative begins with the sudden disappearance of their father, Adam, after he takes Eugene to a local park. When Eugene returns home alone, disheveled and bloody, Mia realizes something is wrong. As the family becomes frantic and calls the police,

they are drawn into a tense investigation led by Detective Morgan Janus. As the search for Adam unfolds, the family grapples with their secrets and the complexities of their relationships. Detective Janus discovers Adam's notebook titled "Happiness Quotient," which contains data on the family's happiness levels and reflects Adam's obsession with measuring and improving their happiness. The investigation reveals that Adam had been communicating with a therapist named Anjeli Rapari, who was helping Eugene learn to communicate through a letterboard. Initially suspected of an affair, Anjeli's true role becomes a pivotal point in the story.

People on the margins are individuals or groups who are pushed to the fringes of society, leaving them with significantly less power, resources, and influence than those in the mainstream. The concept of "the margins" is a metaphor for the social, economic, and political edges where people are often made to feel insignificant and are excluded from full participation in community life.

This workshop will examine the BELOVED* model of sharing, practicing ways to include individuals and groups in community life. In addition, adaptations of the "7-Prompts"* will facilitate a better understanding of what it means to live in the margins and what it means to stand with those who are marginalized. The outcome of this workshop is to receive insights and training so the participant can use this process in churches and other group settings.

Rev. Duane Crumrine and Rev. Beckie Miller Zeek will be our facilitators.

*Districts in the Church of the Brethren, with the encouragement of Annual Conference, have developed discernment practices around issues that affect people of color. In this session, we will adapt the materials developed for that purpose to broaden the scope to include all people who live in the margins of society.



On Sunday, December 21st, we will be including a time to support those in our church family who may be experiencing a period of grief, or who are remembering loved ones and feeling a sense of sadness. "Blue Christmas" will be a part of our morning worship and those who choose to do so will have an opportunity to light a candle in remembrance of loved ones and may also be anointed for comfort and healing. Others in the congregation will also be invited to be anointed. If you have any questions, please speak with Pastor Dave.

The "White Gift" offering to be collected Christmas Eve will be split between the Roaring Spring Ministerium for local individuals in need, the Church of the Brethren Middle PA District to help with operating costs, and Heifer Project International.
